


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From the Interim Artistic Director

Welcome to our inaugural production of *The Inferno Project: Limbo.* I hesitate to say "inaugural," because while it is the first production of New Circle Theatre Company, we're a company that has been in existence in one form or another for over 20 years! You will see people on stage today who were part of Circle Repertory Company, or the Circle Rep Lab, or The LAB Theater Company, or Circle East, or all of them, all of which are our ancestors. Through all of those years, our mission has remained the same: to develop and produce new American plays.

When I was asked to become the Interim Artistic Director following the death of Michael Warren Powell last year, I was deeply honored and equally frightened: not only how was I going to fill Michael's shoes if at all possible, but how was I going to galvanize a group of people who had scattered not only to other theatre companies, but across the entire country.

We had no money. (We still don't! More below.) We did have Powell's apartment to use as office/rehearsal space, thanks to arrangements made by Dick Hughes and the generosity of Douglas Durst and Chashama, Inc. But to galvanize our company, I wanted to focus our attention on a large, multi-year project that would involve lots of people. So, *The Inferno Project* was born: using Dante's *Inferno*, we would use one circle of hell (or perhaps two) each year for the next several years, starting with the First Circle: "Limbo," to create new plays. (It was strange how "limbo" resonated with so many of us after the election last fall, when so many of us felt a sense of limbo both personally and nationally.)

I put the idea out to the company to see what sort of response we'd receive. Our writers were told to use "limbo" in any way they'd like, however it inspired them. And the response was wonderful: over 60 short plays were received, and we decided to produce 16 of them in two separate programs. (I hope you'll like today's program so much that you'll come to see the other one as well!) *The Inferno Project: Limbo* involves 16 plays, 16 directors, 5 designers, and some 35 actors. It was quite an undertaking!

"Midway upon the journey of our life/I found myself within a dark forest,/for the straightforward pathway had been lost," are the lines that begin Dante Alighieri's *Inferno*, the first book in his 1314 epic poem *The Divine Comedy*. Who among us hasn't been metaphorically lost in a dark forest? And perhaps Dante's words resonate even more in this historic time as we question whether we are lost as a culture.

Inferno chronicles Dante's journey into hell guided by the ghost of the great Roman poet Virgil. Dante's hell consists of nine levels, or rings. The first level in Dante's Nine Rings of Hell is Limbo, the subject of NCTC's inaugural production as we cut our own theatrical pathway through the Inferno (limbo is the ring of hell where the virtuous who did not accept Christ into their lives find themselves, because they were either born before Christianity or they died as unbaptized babies).

Dante's medieval world was under the control of the Roman Catholic Church and his views of hell are colored by the Church's views of sin, punishment, and ascension to heaven through the acceptance of Christ. Other religious traditions have their own versions of damnation, but Googling the word "hell" produces 708,000,000 responses, so the idea of hell is still on our minds! When Artistic Director Jon Fraser raised the idea of a multi-season exploration of the *Inferno* to honor Dante on the 700th Anniversary of his death in 2021, the artists of NCTC were inspired to look into the abyss.

How would contemporary writers respond to the idea of hell? We asked NCTC playwrights to write plays on the theme of Limbo, the first of Dante's rings. We left them free to interpret Limbo any way they wanted and tonight you will see these diverse interpretations, from encounters with the dead (*The Last Box*), the afterlife (*Madcap, No Way to Know*), a disturbing future (*Silo #3*), an uncertain past (*When the Ghost Walks*); some of the plays explore characters' personal hell (*Tato Bien!, Home*), and some touch heaven (*A Limbo Large and Broad, Men on the Moon*). The eight rings that follow Limbo are Lust, Gluttony, Greed, Wrath, Heresy, Violence (this ring of hell is so serious it has sub-rings for murder, suicide, blasphemy, sodomy, and usury), Fraud, and finally Treachery. We can't wait to create plays on those subjects!
