CHARACTERS

CARSON NORTH: (60s) A jaded actor.

BILLY SANDERS: (20s) An actor. Black

ASHLEY OLIVE: (20s) an actress.

SCENE ONE

The green room of an old theatre. Classic movie posters line the walls. There are two sofa and a chaise by a minibar. Its glory still exists beyond the fading and dated wallpaper. Outside the room you can hear the hustle of people moving frantically.

CARSON lies across the chaise, drinking from a flask. A trophy beside his head. He flips over facing away from the door. BILLY enters, addresses the press.

BILLY

I'm sorry I can't answer any more questions. You all have a good night. Thank you.

He crosses to a sofa. He looks at the trophy, kisses it.

CARSON

First one?

BILLY

Yeah. Just won for Best Supporting Actor.

CARSON

First one always feels important.

Carson turns over, taking another long swig from his flask.

BILLY

Holy shit you're Carson North!

CARSON

The one and only.

BILLY

Yo! I'm a huge fan sir. I've seen all of your movies, like every single one! I even loved *Love Hunters*

CARSON

No one loves, *Love Hunters*. I don't even love, *Love Hunters*.

BILLY

Well, I do. It's a good film, If you get passed the strange pacing and choppy editing. No offense. It's what inspired me to start acting when I was ten. Your role as Gideon Smith was awe inspiring.

CARSON

How old are you kid?

BILLY

Twenty-four.

CARSON

(sitting up)

Jesus. One day you're thirty on top of the world inspiring kids when they're ten...or whatever. The next it's fourteen years later and you have to do some shitty indie to grasp even the tinniest bit of relevancy.

BILLY

Wow sir...

(noticing the award)

Congrats on the award.

CARSON

Kid that shit means nothing. I mean for you it must be a sign that things are looking up, but for me it's a message of just how far I've fallen.

BILLY

A message?

CARSON

I've been nominated for Tonys, Emmys and even an Oscar, won a few and now here I am at a worthless film festival in Topeka-fucking-Kansas receiving a lifetime achievement award.

BILLY

I would kill for a lifetime achievement award, that's an ultimate honor.

CARSON

That's where your inexperience shows kid.

BILLY

My names, Billy Sanders.

CARSON

BILLY

CARSON
Interesting.

BILLY
I'm not gonna sell out.

CARSON

BILLY

CARSON

BILLY

CARSON

BILLY

How do you know I'm not? You just assumed this award was me selling out when actually the part I played was that of a doctor. Not a thug and definitely was not a slave. One who did really good by his community. You are right about a lot of things said here tonight. But me being a sell out ain't one of them.

ASHLEY

Good for you Billy!

BILLY

Everything, I do, every part I'm going to play is for that kid like me who goes to the movies to dream, to see what is possible. Thats why I do what I do because everything is bigger than me. When you're Black. That is life. You are in a position in life where you can take back what was lost. So instead of complaining to two early career twenty-somethings, take it back and do something about it.

CARSON

Way to find your voice kid.

Carson takes another swig.

BILLY

It's Billy Sanders. Remember it.

Well Billy Sanders, if you like your name, keep it. Don't let anyone talk you out of it. Cause one day they're going to engrave it into a lifetime achievement award and you'll want the person you see yourself as reflected on it.

BILLY

Thanks Carmen.

CARSON

Thank you. I'll see you both at the afterparty.

ASHLEY

Bye Carmen.

Carson exits.

ASHLEY

He knows the after party is at an Olive Garden, in a mall, right?

BILLY

I don't think he knows what an Olive Garden is.

Ashely and Billy leave the stage taking their awards with them.

END OF PLAY
